Winterblast 2023 Medication Policy

If your student needs to take prescription or over-the-counter medication at while at YouthCrossing Winterblast here are some important rules and policies to follow:

Prescription Medications:

Students *will not be allowed* to have prescription medications of any kind with them while at camp. If your child needs to take a prescription medication while at camp, you will need to complete a *Medication Authorization Form* and turn it in, along with the medication, when you check-in at camp. Prescription medications must be in a prescription-labeled container; the label stating the child's name, current date, name of medication and directions for administration.

Over-the-Counter Medications:

Students *will be allowed* to have over-the-counter medications with them while at camp. If you would prefer that our First-Aid team administer your child's over-the-counter medication, you will need to complete a *Medication Authorization Form*, and turn it in, along with the medication, when you check-in at camp. All over-the-counter medications must be in the original container.

Rescue Inhalers and Epi Pens

If your child has asthma or a severe allergy and you and your child's physician believe it necessary for your child to carry a "rescue" inhaler or epipen, as opposed to keeping it with First Aid, please contact youth@thecrossing.church
